## 2010 Glenmore 36 Hole Open – Tournament Conditions

1. The Glenmore 36 Hole Open is open to male amateur golfers having a current Golf Australia handicap with an affiliated golf club.
2. All competitors MUST provide their current golflink#.
3. The Rules of Golf and local rules apply for the duration of the Glenmore 36 Hole Open.
4. The Glenmore Match Committee has sole control of the Glenmore 36 Hole Open and reserves the right to vary the conditions should they deem it advisable.
5. Protests: Protests must be made in writing and submitted to the Match Committee within fifteen (15) minutes of the conclusion of the day's play.
6. Any disputes or protests will be decided by the Match Committee of Glenmore and their decision shall be final (Rule 34.3)
7. All players must report to the starter at least 15 minutes prior to their allocated tee time.
8. All scorecards must be completed and submitted to the Match Committee representative inside the clubhouse immediately upon leaving the course. No card will be accepted after the results are recorded. No cards will be accepted after 15 minutes of the final group completing the 18<sup>th</sup> hole.
9. Only one trophy may be won per person.
10. All ties will be decided by count back, except for the Glenmore 36 Hole Open. In the event of a tie for the Glenmore 36 Hole Open a three hole playoff will be held starting on the 1<sup>st</sup> hole, followed by the 2<sup>nd</sup> and then the 9<sup>th</sup>. If scores are still tied at this point, a sudden death playoff will take place using the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> holes until a decision is reached.
11. Mobile Phones: the use of a mobile phone or portable phone by a competitor or his caddie, whilst on the golf course during an event is distracting and inconsiderate. If the competitor or his caddie is in the possession of a mobile or portable phone it should be turned off. If the phone rings this is deemed to be in use and the committee may take disciplinary action against the offending player in accordance with the concluding paragraph of section 1 Etiquette of the Rules of Golf. Players or caddies, who have a medical or serious reason to have their mobile phone switched on, must inform the starter. Should the starter agree this reason is substantial, the player or caddie may have the phone switched on in silent mode.
12. Entries close, 5pm, Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2010. The draw will be available on the clubs website, [www.glenmoregolf.com.au](http://www.glenmoregolf.com.au), from the 18<sup>th</sup> January 2010.
