2010 Glenmore Cup – Tournament Conditions

1. The Glenmore Cup is open to male amateur golfers having a current Golf Australia handicap with an affiliated golf club.
2. All entries MUST have a valid golflink#.
3. The handicap limit for visitors is 4. In the event that the number of entries exceeds the number of available tee times, a ballot will be conducted based on the handicaps of the players entered and at the discretion of the match committee.
4. The Rules of Golf and local rules apply for the duration of the Glenmore Cup.
5. The Glenmore Match Committee has sole control of the Glenmore Cup and reserves the right to vary the conditions should they deem it advisable.
6. Protests: Protests must be made in writing and submitted to the Match Committee within fifteen (15) minutes of the conclusion of the day's play.
7. Any disputes or protests will be decided by the Match Committee of Glenmore and their decision shall be final (Rule 34.3)
8. All players must report to the starter at least 15 minutes prior to their allocated tee time.
9. All scorecards must be completed and submitted to the Match Committee representative inside the clubhouse immediately upon leaving the course. No card will be accepted after the results are recorded. No cards will be accepted after 15 minutes of the final group completing the 18th hole.
10. Only one trophy may be won per person.
11. All ties will be decided by count back, except for the Glenmore Cup. In the event of a tie for the Glenmore Cup a three hole playoff will be held starting on the 1st hole, followed by the 2nd and then the 9th. If scores are still tied at this point, a sudden death playoff will take place using the 1st, 2nd and 9th holes until a decision is reached.
12. Mobile Phones: the use of a mobile phone or portable phone by a competitor or his caddie, whilst on the golf course during an event is distracting and inconsiderate. If the competitor or his caddie is in the possession of a mobile or portable phone it should be turned off. If the phone rings this is deemed to be in use and the committee may take disciplinary action against the offending player in accordance with the concluding paragraph of section 1 Etiquette of the Rules of Golf. Players or caddies, who have a medical or serious reason to have their mobile phone switched on, must inform the starter. Should the starter agree this reason is substantial, the player or caddie may have the phone switched on in silent mode.
13. Locomotion: Players will not generally be permitted to ride in, or on, any form of automotive locomotion, during the Glenmore Cup. An exception will be made in the case of a player affected by a disability, which makes it necessary for the player to use automotive locomotion. It will be necessary for the player seeking exception to produce the following:
 - a. a certificate or letter from a Medical Practitioner specifying
 - i. the disability by which the player is affected;
 - ii. the medical practitioner's opinion that the disability necessitates the player requiring the use of automotive locomotion in order to participate in the competition;
 - b. in the case of a permanent disability a letter from the Secretary of the Club, confirming that the player does not participate in any games of golf at that Club except with the assistance of automotive locomotion;
 - c. in the case of a temporary disability a letter from the Secretary of the Club confirming that the player does not presently participate in any games of golf at the Club except with the assistance of automotive locomotion and nominating the period for which permission to use automotive locomotion is granted.

The Club accepts no responsibility for the availability of automotive locomotion.

The Match Committee shall allow caddies to use transportation provided:

- I. The player does not accept a ride at any time.
- II. The player does not accept advice from any other person travelling with the caddie.

14. Entries must be on the official entry form (a photocopy of the entry form will also be accepted) and must be accompanied by the entry fee. Entries close, 5pm, Friday 20th February 2010. The draw will be available on the clubs website, www.glenmoregolf.com.au, from the 22nd February 2010.
